Meeting Presentation Summary and Guest Speaker

Presentation Summary:

Philip Fine will provide an overview and update on the Bay Area Air Quality Management District, including the District's work on AB 617 implementation in Alameda County, and other regulatory initiatives.

Guest Speaker Bio:

Dr. Philip Fine serves as the Executive Officer/Air Pollution Control Officer for the Air District, one of the preeminent air quality management agencies in the United States. As Executive Officer for the Air District, Dr. Fine is responsible for all agency functions and activities, including policy and rule development, enforcement, permitting, technology development, planning, grant allocation, administration and engagement with communities disproportionately impacted by air pollution to address environmental justice concerns.

Dr. Fine joined the Air District from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, where he served as Principal Deputy Associate Administrator for Policy, a presidentially appointed position. In this role, he led the Office of Environmental Justice through a period of unprecedented attention, action, and growth, including the implementation of President Biden's Justice40 initiative.

Prior to his term at the U.S. EPA, Dr. Fine served for 15 years at the South Coast Air Quality Management District in Southern California, the last five years in the position of Deputy Executive Officer for the Planning, Rule Development and Area Sources Division.

Before joining the South Coast Air Quality Management District, Dr. Fine was a Research Assistant Professor at the University of Southern California, Los Angeles. There he taught courses and conducted extensive research on particulate pollution, air monitoring technologies, and exposure assessment.

Dr. Fine received his Ph.D. from the California Institute of Technology in Environmental Science & Engineering, and his bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering and Materials Science & Engineering from the University of California, Berkeley.
